

Issues: Drawing inspiration from unlikely sources, from Washington Capitals players to a book from the Dark Ages filled with designs for some of the first planned cities in Europe. Also, when being compared to influential bands such as Nirvana becomes a burden instead of a compliment.

Description: This Delta blues duo joined us in studio for an interview and live performances of songs from their new album, "Midnight

Issues: The hazards of recording in one of Maryland's oldest houses, and how differently the Delta blues are received in England as opposed to U.S.
